

## Notice of Land Use Decision City Council Denial of US Market Gas Station

Summary of Decision: DENIAL

*Procedural History:* Woodburn Planning Commission June 9, 2022: Approved with conditions.

Appeal: Type III decisions rendered by the Planning Commission are appealable to the City Council. The City Council's decision is the City's final decision. The last date to appeal the Planning Commission's decision for consolidated applications for the US Market applications was June 27, 2022. The Woodburn Fast Sery Inc. and LB Group, LLC, represented by David J. Petersen of Tonkon Torp, LLC, timely appealed by submitting a Notice of Intent to Appeal, dated June 21, 2022, which included each of the elements required by WDO 4.02. 01. 8. 2., including a statement of the grounds for the appeal.

The City Council held a public hearing on the appeal at its regularly scheduled meeting on July 25, 2022. Following the testimony and closure of the record, a motion was made to (i) Overturn the Planning Commission's Decision; (ii) Tentatively Deny the Consolidated Applications and direct Staff to return with a final decision at the next Council meeting. The motion was seconded. A vote was taken and the City Council voted 4-0 in support of the motion overturning the Planning Commission decision and denying the applications.

On August 8, 2022, the City Council approved the Final Decision document.
