

CLEANING AND DISINFECTING

<p>EPA's Disinfecting Products</p> 	<p>Which products should you use? Chlorine (bleach) is one of them but there are many others.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> EPA's COVID-19 website includes their List N registered products. Also includes a useful Q&A. If using bleach, mix 5 tablespoons (1/3 cup) bleach per gallon of water OR 4 teaspoons bleach per quart of water. Bleach solutions will be effective for disinfection up to 24 hours. 	 <p>COVID-19 Disinfectants</p>

<p>Cleaning And Disinfecting Community Facilities</p> 	<p>Major cleaning guide</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A detailed one-page website covering how to clean and disinfect community facilities such as schools, institutions of higher education, offices, daycare centers, businesses, and community centers. • Also could be used by some ALH facilities. 	 <p>Cleaning & Disinfecting Community Facilities</p> <p>English-Inglés Spanish-Español</p>
	<p>Agricultural labor housing (ALH) operators must provide cleaning materials <u>at no cost</u>, allowing occupants to clean and sanitize their living areas regularly.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The rule does not specify which products to use to clean and sanitize. The word sanitation was chosen instead of disinfect. Hot soap and water can be used, no specific products are required. • The user should use the product in accordance with manufacturer instructions (label). • Sanitizing is meant to reduce, not kill, the occurrence and growth of bacteria, viruses and fungi. Disinfecting a surface will “kill” the microscopic organisms as claimed on the label of a particular product. 	<p>No link, employer selects products and suppliers.</p>

FACE COVERINGS

<p>Guidance on Face Coverings</p>	<p>As Oregon moves toward reopening businesses and public spaces, measures to prevent the transmission of COVID-19 will be more important than ever:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Physical distancing • Washing hands often • Cleaning surfaces often • Covering your cough • Staying home when you are sick, and • Using face coverings (either cloth, paper, or disposable) as appropriate. 	 <p>Guidance on Face Coverings</p> <p>English-Inglés Spanish-Español</p>
<p>Face Coverings</p>	<p>Cloth face coverings prevent the person wearing the mask from spreading respiratory droplets when talking, sneezing, or coughing Explains how to wear and make home-made face coverings including that the covering:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Fit snugly but comfortably against the side of the face • Be secured with ties or ear loops • Include multiple layers of fabric • Allow for breathing without restriction • Be able to be laundered and machine dried without damage or change to shape <p>Includes Tutorials on how to make a home-made covering.</p>	 <p>Make and Wear Face Coverings</p>  <p>English-Inglés Spanish-Español</p>


