






While running away from home a thirteen-year-old Eskimo girl becomes lost on the North Slope of Alaska and is befriended by a wolf pack. 170 pages.






Humphrey Adventures series by Betty G. Birney





A Siamese cat, an old bull terrier, and a young Labrador retriever travel together 250 miles through the Canadian wilderness to find their family. 148 pages.






Pax by Sara Pennypacker
