CONTINUED OPERATION IS A SERIOUS DANGER TO PUBLIC HEALTH AND SAFETY

The Governor of Oregon has declared an emergency under ORS 401.165 due to the public health threat posed by the novel infectious coronavirus (COVID-19). The Governor has ordered that immediate implementation of social distancing and community mitigation measures are necessary to slow the spread of COVID-19.

Penalty for failure to comply could include immediate suspension.

On March 17, 2020, the Governor issued Executive Order 20-07 prohibiting:

- Restaurants, bars, taverns, brew pubs, wine bars, cafes, food courts, coffee shops, clubs or other similar establishments that offer food or drink from offering or allowing on-premises consumption of food or drink.
- Social, spiritual, and recreational gatherings of 25 people or more.

These prohibitions apply statewide under ORS 433.441(3)(a),(b),(d) and (f), ORS 401.168(1) and ORS 401.188(1)(3).

Your actions are potentially in direct contravention to the Executive Order which directs all bars and restaurants to refrain from these activities and to implement social distancing protocols for staff and customers.

Establishments may offer food or drink for off-premises consumption (e.g., take-out or drive-through) or for delivery, depending on your license type.
